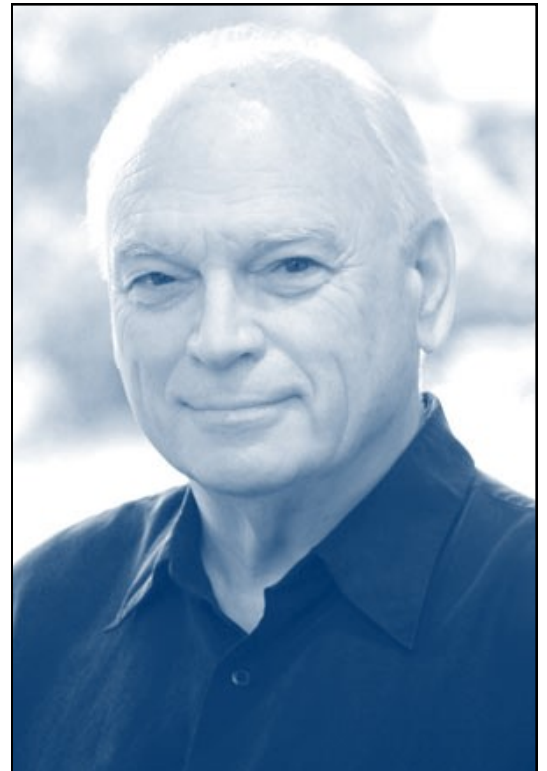
HAPPY *25th* Anniversary

The Festival will be very special this year as we celebrate Maestro James Paul's 25th Anniversary as Music Director and Principal Conductor. His musical accomplishments span the globe and we realize how privileged we are that he has chosen to grace our stage with his expertise, passion, and good humor.

James is widely acclaimed as one of North America's most distinguished conductors. Mr. Paul has served as music director and conductor of the Baton Rouge Symphony, principal guest Conductor of the Louisiana Philharmonic, associate conductor of the Kansas City Symphony and Milwaukee Symphony, conducting fellow of the St. Louis Symphony, and artistic advisor to the Tulsa Philharmonic. Mr. Paul joined our OCMF family in 1990.

After six seasons as principal conductor of the Grant Park Music Festival, he also served as artistic director of the Sewance Summer Festival from 2006 to 2009. Mr. Paul's illustrious career has included guest appearances with some of the world's finest orchestras. North American engagements included performances with the Calgary Philharmonic, Chicago Symphony, Cleveland Orchestra, Columbus Symphony, Dallas Symphony, Florida Orchestra, Honolulu Symphony, Houston Symphony, Indianapolis Symphony, Jacksonville, Symphony, Milwaukee Symphony, Minnesota Orchestra, National Symphony in Washington D.C, Oakland Symphony, Omaha Symphony, Oregon Symphony, Philadelphia Orchestra, Phoenix Symphony, Pittsburgh Symphony, San Antonio Symphony, San Francisco Symphony, Seattle Symphony, Symphony Nova Scotia, Tulsa Philharmonic, Vancouver Symphony and Winnipeg Symphony.

Overseas he also visited the podiums of the Beijing Symphony, London Symphony Orchestra, Orchestre Colonne (France), Orchestre Symphonique Francais, Orquesta Sinfonica de Zalapa (Mexico), Orquesta Sinfonica Nacional de Costa Rica, Orquesta Sinfonica Nacional de Mixico, Royal Sottish National Orchestra, Singapore Symphony, Tempere Philharmonic (Finland), Tonkünstlerorchester (Austria), and the West Australian Symphony (Perth).

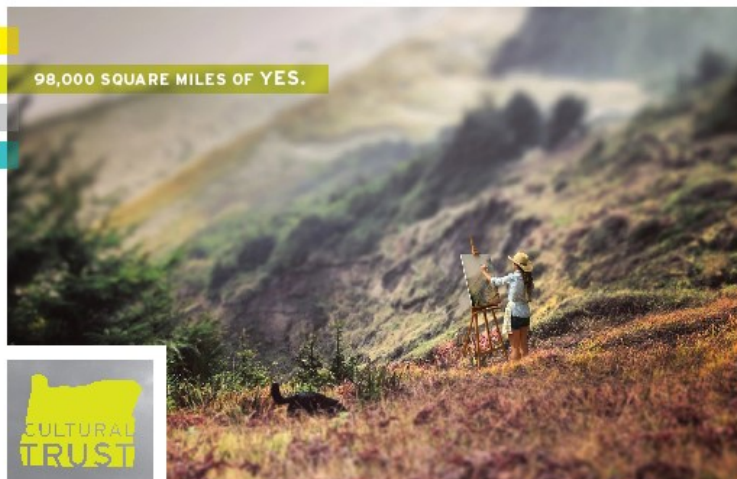

ADAM STERN CONDUCTS 2016 POPS



Adam Stern was born in Hollywood in 1955. He began his musical studies at age five as a piano student, and began flute lessons two years later. At 15, Stern was accepted at California Institute of the Arts, where he initially majored in flute performance, but changed his major to conducting in his second year at the urging of the late Gerhard Samuel, a noted conductor and educator. Stern was graduated in 1977 with an MFA in conducting at 21, the youngest Masters degree recipient in CalArts' history.

Mr. Stern has been leading the Seattle Philharmonic Orchestra since 2003. During his tenure he has brought numerous world, U.S., West Coast and Northwest premieres to the Puget Sound community. Stern's unique programming combines beloved masterworks with must-hear rarities; his programs are not merely concerts, but true musical events. In September 2015 came word of two new appointments for Stern: Music Director of the Sammamish Symphony, and Assistant Conductor/"Pops" Conductor of the Oregon Coast Music Festival beginning in summer of 2016.

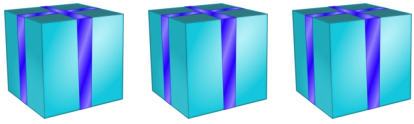
